

E-DATES	DATES	ABBREVIATED MEASURE CALENDAR Primary Presidential Election – March 5 <sup>th</sup> , 2024
E-88	Friday December 8 <sup>th</sup> , 2023	Deadline for local ordinances, resolutions, tax rate statements for bond measure or orders for calling an election to be filed with the Elections Division. (EC § 10401, 10402, 10403)
E-85	Monday December 11 <sup>th</sup> , 2023	On this day, the Elections Official will assign a letter of designation to each local measure that will appear on the ballot. Measures will be assigned in alphabetical order 85 days before the election by the Elections Official. Beginning with the letter following the last letter assigned in the previous election, assignments will continue through Z, or as close to the end of the alphabet as possible to accommodate all measures filed for the current election. (EC § 13116, 13109)
E-83	Wednesday December 13 <sup>th</sup> , 2023	Deadline to withdraw a measure that has been submitted to the voters of any jurisdiction at an election. The order of election shall not be amended or withdrawn after this date. (EC § 9605)
E-83	Wednesday December 13 <sup>th</sup> , 2023	Deadline to submit Arguments IN FAVOR OF or AGAINST a local measure. NOT to exceed 300 words in length. (EC § 9162, 9163, 9286, 9315, 9316, 9501, 9502, 9503)
E-82 to E-72**	Thursday December 14 <sup>th</sup> , 2023-Sunday December 24 <sup>th</sup> , 2023	10-calendar day public review period for Arguments IN FAVOR OF or AGAINST any measure. During this 10-calendar day review period, any person may seek Writ of Mandate or injunction requiring any or all of the material in the Argument IN FAVOR OF or AGAINST to be amended or deleted. All Writs of Mandate must be filed by the end of the 10-calendar day public examination period. (EC § 9190, 9380, 9509)
E-81	Friday December 15 <sup>th</sup> , 2023	Impartial Analysis due from County Counsel for measures. NOT to exceed 500 words in length. (EC § 9160, 9313, 9500)
E-81	Friday December 15 <sup>th</sup> , 2023	Deadline to submit Rebuttals to Arguments IN FAVOR OF or AGAINST a measure argument. NOT to exceed 250 words in length. (EC § 9167, 9317, 9504)
E-80** to E-70	Saturday December 16 <sup>th</sup> , 2023-Tuesday December 26 <sup>th</sup> , 2023	10-calendar day public review period for Rebuttals to Arguments IN FAVOR OF or AGAINST any measure. During this 10-calendar day review period, any person may seek Writ of Mandate or injunction requiring any or all of the material in the Rebuttal to Arguments IN FAVOR OF or AGAINST to be amended or deleted. All Writs of Mandate must be filed by the end of the 10-calendar day public examination period. (EC § 9190, 9380, 9509)

E-29	Monday February 5 <sup>th</sup> , 2024	Ballots are mailed to all voters. (EC § 3000.5)
E-29	Monday February 5 <sup>th</sup> , 2024	Elections Division to begin processing Vote-by-Mail ballots on the 29 <sup>th</sup> business day before the election. (EC § 15101)
<b>E-0 ELECTION DAY</b>	<b>Tuesday March 5<sup>th</sup>, 2024</b>	All Polling Sites open from 7 a.m. – 8 p.m. All ballots mailed must be postmarked on or before Election Day to count in the election. (EC § 1000, 14212)
E+7	Tuesday February 27 <sup>th</sup> , 2024	Last day to receive a properly postmarked mailed ballot. (EC § 3020)
E+28	Tuesday April 2 <sup>nd</sup> , 2024	Completion of canvass – for Presidential contest. (EC § 15375)
E+30	Thursday April 4 <sup>th</sup> , 2024	Completion of canvass. (EC § 15372)
